



Who is Dr. Glahn?



Dr. Terre Glahn, is an internationally known expert in the field of Autism, who has recently relocated to British Columbia. She has a wealth of experience as a researcher, trainer, consultant, and lecturer in the area of ASD. Dr. Glahn holds a PhD in Educational Psychology as well as being a Board Certified Behaviour Analyst. She has had several research papers published and has presented at numerous conferences in the US, Britain, China, Taiwan and Canada. She has been a leader and innovator since she began her work in the field of autism spectrum disorders in 1973, as a parent trainer, under Dr. Robert Koegel in California. In the '80's she was a staff psychologist at the Camarillo State Hospital (CSH) and director of their behaviour learning laboratory. During this period she worked in a team of researchers lead by **Dr. Ivar Lovaas**. (continued next page)

Dr. Glahn's approach:

- ABA provides the framework for assessing, developing, and implementing individualized programming for children, youth, and adults with ASD. This framework emphasizes the need for naturalistic learning opportunities, preferences, and choices to ensure maintenance and generalization of individual accomplishments.
- Parents, teachers, and other concerned persons **MUST** be a part of the intervention from the beginning.
- The intervention must be consistent, ongoing, and undertaken within the context of a "learning to learn" approach (i.e., listening skills, looking in the direction of instructions, following directions, following multiple cues, being part of the classroom community); with ongoing attention to motivational factors and individual learning styles and experiential strategies. Dr Glahn has focused on program development and leadership, researching, teaching and training, and consulting. For example, Dr. Glahn has served as Executive Director to the CSH Transitional Teaching Homes where she developed inclusive living for persons with developmental disabilities; as well as developing and directing the Behavior Resource Center, a teaching center for children, youth, and adults with ASD, ADHD, and other developmental disabilities, resulting in numerous publications on the topic. She developed and facilitated graduate student autism programs for the Dept. of Developmental Services in California and has developed autism clinics. She has consulted on the development of ABA related programs for home, school, and vocational settings. Since moving to BC, Dr. Glahn is a clinician with the Fraser Developmental Clinic staff and Clinical Director of Autism Services at The Children's Foundation.
